Dear Classmates and Friends,

As we have developed plans for our Reunion Celebration, we have been discussing the possibility of financially supporting some initiatives or events with donations. The following are <u>FIVE</u> opportunities for classmates and friends to help bring ideas and plans to fruition:

OPTION 1 (our primary focus)

Roush Industries has developed a 3-phase program for the training of students. It is The Roush Career Intern Sponsorship Program (CISP) which is a partnership between Roush Industries and local high schools. The program consists of a co-op program, a summer intern program, and then possible hiring at Roush as a full-time employee. Students will have the opportunity for training in Creative Services, Engineering, Testing and Development, Prototyping, and Manufacturing. After successfully completing a 90-day probationary period, full-time employees are eligible to participate in Roush full benefits package including: medical, dental, vision, company-paid lifeTo be determine insurance, 401(k) with company match, company-paid uniforms, paid holidays, and paid vacation time. These opportunities are no cost to the districts or students.

In late March, our reunion committee was able to help facilitate a meeting with the Superintendent of Schools, the Principal and Assistant Principal of Thurston, a district curriculum representative, the President of a division of Roush, the Intern Sponsor at Roush, the Counselor from Franklin High School, and four members of our committee. There was a presentation about the program at Roush, a Q & A opportunity, and at the end of the conversation, Roush extended an opportunity to have students and graduates from Thurston High School participate in the Career Intern Sponsorship Program. We are very pleased to be involved in helping to provide a future to Thurston students and graduates.

We would provide a tool box and tools to assist in this (see appendix for a detailed list of the toolbox). This tool box and tools would be used by Thurston High School students as they work at a Roush site. They would check out tools as they need them and then return them to the tool box. They would be used by the Phase 1 and Phase 2 students.

Our goal would be to purchase 1 complete tool list. But if we were able to purchase 2 complete lists of materials, it would support more students at a time. Cost is \$1,700 per toolbox

OPTION 2

Thurston High School Alumni Association is looking to develop a database of graduates. The goal is to locate as many of THS graduates so that communication between the school/district and graduates can be developed and enhanced. As other school districts have realized, when individuals have knowledge about current events and the mission and vision of their high school and the school district, a supportive relationship develops.

We would like to support the cost of the development of the database. The district may be working with a professional service to locate graduates. Estimated cost: \$1,000.00 - \$3,000.00 – any support is welcome.

OPTION 3

We have developed activities for the weekend of our reunion. Included are the hospitality events on Friday, September 14th. We have a hospitality suite at the Marriott Hotel where we will provide beverages and snacks. In addition, we have reserved space at Bar Louie in the complex at 6 Mile and Newburgh Rd./1275. We will be providing some non-alcoholic beverages and snacks at no cost to the reunion attendees in the hospitality suite. Individuals will purchase their own food and beverages at Bar Louie.

We have planned a Golf Scramble Outing on Friday, September at Salem Hills Golf Course. Individuals will pay for their round of golf and cart. Information and registration can be found on our website.

On the evening of September 15th, we will have our major event at the Marriott Hotel in Livonia. Attendees will pay for their ticket which includes dinner, DJ, photo booth, special program and more.

We would like to enhance our planned events with financial support for the purchase of the food and beverages in the hospitality suite at the Marriott Hotel; provide snacks for golfers at the golf outing; elevate our Saturday night event with an enhanced dessert bar for attendees. We also welcome other ideas. Estimated Cost: generosity of donors

OPTION 4

In past reunion planning, we have attempted to put aside funds, if possible, for the next celebration. It is much easier to secure the venue and other components of the event if some monies are put aside. While we have not determined the date/year of our next celebration/reunion, we would have more choices if we were able to have a financial base to help initiate the planning. The class of 1967 is planning an event just one year after their big celebration last year.

We would like to maintain funds for the next celebration for our graduates. No date has been determined, but could occur as soon as next year or in 5 years as we hear suggestions from our classmates. Estimated cost: \$500.00 - \$1,000.00.

OPTION 5

Donated monies designation to be determined by Reunion Committee
